A RESOLUTION OF THE LEWISVILLE CITY COUNCIL SUPPORTING THE CITY OF LEWISVILLE'S APPLICATION TO THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S 2025 TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES SET-ASIDE (TA) CALL FOR PROJECTS TO INCLUDE PEDESTRIAN IMPROVEMENTS ALONG STATE HIGHWAY 121 BUSINESS, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$5,200,000 AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER OR HER DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE ALL DOCUMENTS RELATING THERETO; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Lewisville ("City") has identified through the adoption of the Business 121 Corridor Plan a need for improved pedestrian infrastructure along State Highway 121 Business including a need for wider and connected sidewalks and safer crossings at intersections; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Department of Transportation issued a call for projects in January 2025 for communities to apply for funding assistance through the Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside (TA) Program; and

WHEREAS, the TA funds may be used for development of preliminary engineering (plans, specifications, and estimates and environmental documentation) and construction of pedestrian and/or bicycle infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the TA funds require a local match, comprised of cash or Transportation Development Credits (TDCs), if eligible, and the City of Lewisville would be responsible for all non-reimbursable costs and 100% of overruns, if any, for TA funds; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEWISVILLE, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. The findings and recitations contained in the preamble of this resolution are incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2. The City of Lewisville supports funding this project(s) as described in the 2025 TA Detailed Application (including the preliminary engineering budget, if any, construction budget, the department's direct state cost for oversight, and the required local match, if any). This project includes the addition of sidewalks, replacement of substandard sidewalks, high visibility intersection striping, addition of curb ramps, replacement of substandard curb ramps, addition of pedestrian push poles and relocation of pedestrian push-poles.

SECTION 3. The City of Lewisville is willing to commit to the project's development, implementation, construction, maintenance, management, and financing.

SECTION 4. The City of Lewisville is willing and able to enter into an agreement with the department by resolution or ordinance, should the project be selected for funding in an amount not to exceed \$5,200,000.00.

SECTION 5. The City Manager or her designee is hereby authorized to execute all documents relating to this above-described program on behalf of the City of Lewisville.
