ADMINISTRATIVE COMMENTS:

The Gene Carey Animal Shelter and Adoption Center is currently at capacity for large dogs. Mayor Gilmore will highlight a large dog for adoption. The adoption fee for this pet has been waived and all adoptions come with sterilization, microchip, rabies vaccination, and one year of City registration (if Lewisville resident). The Gene Carey Animal Shelter and Adoption Center is located at 995 E. Valley Ridge Blvd. Adoption Center hours are Tuesday from 12 p.m. - 7 p.m.,

E. Public Hearing

1. Public Hearing: Consideration of an Ordinance Granting a Zone Change From General Business (GB) District to Single-Family Residential 5,000 Square Foot Lot (R5) District on 0.285-Acres Legally Described as Stuart Addition Block B, Lot 9; Located at 106 Martin Street; as Requested by Jonathan Kroneman, the Applicant, on Behalf of Inez Aguirre, the Property Owner (24-01-1-PZ).

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMENTS:

106 Martin Street is currently zoned General Business and contains a legal non-conforming residential home. The property owner is seeking to rezone the property to a single-family residential zoning district to subdivide the property and build an additional house on the western portion. The Planning and Zoning Commission recommended unanimous (6-0) approval of this item on February 20, 2024.

2. Public Hearing: Consideration of an Ordinance Adopting Youth Recreational Program Standards of Care in Compliance with Texas Administrative Code (TAC) 745.115(3).

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMENTS:

The Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS) regulates various child day-care operations. Under the Texas Human Resources Code 42.041 (b)(14) and DFPS Rules, 40 TAC 745.115(3), the camps and after school programs

operated by the City of Lewisville Parks and Recreation Department are exempt from these regulations, provided that the City Council annually adopt Youth Recreational Program Standards of Care. The proposed standards are updated to ensure accuracy and consistency in language used throughout the code, as well as including updates staff titles and responsibilities.

F. Visitor/Citizens Forum

Speakers must address their comments to the Mayor rather than to individual Council members or staff. Speakers should speak clearly and state their name and address prior to beginning their remarks. Speakers will be allowed 5 minutes for testimony. Speakers making personal, impertinent, profane or slanderous remarks may be removed from the meeting. Unauthorized remarks from the audience, stamping of feet, whistles, yells, clapping, and similar demonstrations will not be permitted. In accordance with the Texas Open Meetings Act, the City Council is restricted from discussing or taking action on items not listed on the agenda. Action can only be taken at a future meeting.

- 4. <u>Approval of a Bid Award for the Windhaven Parkway and Cookie Lane</u> <u>Traffic Signal Construction Project to Durable Specialties, Inc., in the</u> <u>Amount of \$781,078.10, and Authorization for the City Manager, or Her</u> <u>Designee, to Execute the Contract.</u>

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMENTS:

The proposed contract with Durable Specialties Inc. to install a traffic signal at Cookie Lane and Windhaven Parkway includes installing all required signal equipment, constructing Americans with Disabilities Act ramps, modifying medians, striping pavement markings, and installing traffic signs. A total of thirty-two (32) bid invitations were downloaded from Bonfire. Three (3) bids were received and opened on January 3, 2024. An evaluation of all bids was performed, and Durable Specialties, Inc. is recommended for award as the lowest responsible bidder. Funding is available in the Signal Funding capital project.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>:

That the City Council approve the bid award and authorize the City Manager, or her designee, to execute the agreement as set forth in the caption above.

5. <u>Approval of a Professional Services Agreement with Bartlett & West,</u> <u>Inc., Fort Worth, TX, in the Amount of \$59,995 for Professional</u> <u>Engineering Services for the Replacement of Headwalls on Marchant</u> <u>Place and Ridgeway Circle and Authorization for the City Manager, or</u> <u>Her Designee, to Execute the Agreement.</u>

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMENTS:

The headwalls located in the 1100 Block of Marchant Place and the 200 block of Ridgeway Circle were built in 2001 and 1978 respectively. The headwalls at both locations have begun to display structural damage and need to be rebuilt. Public Services has engaged Bartlett and West Inc. for design services on this project. Funding is available in the Headwall Replacement Capital project.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>:

That the City Council approve the agreement and authorize the City Manager, or her designee, to execute the agreement as set forth in the caption above.

6. <u>Approval of Waiving the Penalty and Interest on Property Tax Account</u> <u>288838DEN Located at 2460 Sunderland Lane for Tax Year 2023 per</u> <u>Texas Tax Code Section 33.011(a)(1).</u>

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMENTS:

The taxpayer for property tax account 288838DEN has requested a waiver of penalty & interest from Denton County. The property owner states that factors

beyond their control resulted in the delay in paying the 2023 tax bill. The taxpayer has paid all taxes, included the penalty and interest as required and has filed this request for waiver and refund of the penalty and interest portion. Denton County recommends approval of waiving the penalty and interest on the account. It is also the opinion of Sawko & Burroughs LLP, the City's property tax attorneys, based on the information provided, the circumstances in this case satisfy the waiver provision in state law. The penalty & interest waiver for the taxpayer is \$109.89. The City's portion of this waiver is \$26.49.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the City Council approve the waiver of the penalty and interest on the property tax account as set forth in the caption above.

7. <u>Acceptance of the Fiscal Year 2023 Annual Comprehensive Financial</u> <u>Report (ACFR).</u>

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMENTS:

The independent annual audit of the City's financial statements is complete. The 2023 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report is provided in compliance with the City Council's Finance Policy Statement 3.0 Section I. The report includes the auditor's opinion statement regarding the financial statement presentation. Also being provided are the Single Audit reports on Federal Financial Assistance (SEFA) and State Financial Assistance (SESA). These two reports capture the City's expenditure of federal and state funds (grants) during the fiscal year. The Popular Annual Financial Report (PAFR) accompanies the ACFR. The PAFR is intended to provide selected information on the City's financial condition in a summarized, easily understandable format.
