ADMINISTRATIVE COMMENTS:

This is the first of two public hearings to consider the Second Amendment to the City's Strategic Partnership Agreement (SPA) between the City and Denton County Fresh Water Supply Districts 1-A, 1-B, 1-C, 1-D, 1-E, 1-F, 1-G, and 1-H. The Second Amendment adds certain tracts of land to the existing SPA, deletes certain tracts of land and replaces them with certain other tracts of land, and extends the term of the existing SPA for limited annexation for sales and use tax purposes only. Texas Local Government Code Section 43.0751 requires governing bodies of the municipality and the specified Districts to hold two public hearings regarding limited annexation.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>:

That the City Council conduct the public hearing.

F. Visitor/Citizens Forum

G. Consent Agenda

All of the following items on the Consent Agenda are considered to be self-explanatory by the Council and will be enacted with one motion. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless a Council Member or citizen so request. ADMINISTRATIVE COMMENTS:

XMPK LLC owns a .0172 acre tract at the southwest corner of Walters and Harris Streets and is proposing to build four (4) townhouse units. This project will add more needed residential units to Old Town. This agreement provides for waiver of roadway escrow fees for Walters and Harris Streets, waiver of park dedication requirements, waiver of building permit fees and a grant equal to the amount of impact fees for the residential units.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>:

That the City Council approve the agreement as set forth in the caption above; and authorize the City Manager to execute the amendment.

4. <u>Approval of the First Amendment to the Economic Development</u> <u>Agreement, Approved on September 15, 2014, Between CADG Mill</u> <u>Street, LLC and the City of Lewisville, and Authorization for the City</u> <u>Manager to Execute the Agreement.</u>

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMENTS:

In 2014, the City and CADG Mill Street, LLC, entered into an Economic Development Agreement for the development of South Village, a mixed-use development located at the southwest corner of Mill and Elm Streets. The Agreement calls for reimbursement of all fees back to the developer based on the number of units completed. The formula calculates fee reimbursements as a fraction of units completed, based on the total units within the development, which is difficult to manage. This amendment simplifies the process by reimbursing the fees already paid, waiving certain fees at the time of permit for new units and providing a grant in the amount of impact fees paid upon completion of new units.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>:

That the City Council approve the amendment to the agreement as set forth in the caption above; and authorize the City Manager to execute the amendment.

5. <u>Approval of the First Amendment to the Economic Development</u> <u>Agreement, Approved on September 10, 2018, Between DFW Lewisville</u> <u>Partners, GP and the City of Lewisville; and Authorization for the City</u> <u>Manager to Execute the Amendment.</u>

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMENTS:

In 2018, the City and DFW Lewisville Partners, GP, entered into an economic development agreement for the development of Majestic Building 7, a 306,280 square foot building for office, warehousing and distribution uses located in the southwestern gateway at the northeast corner of Spinks Road and Valley Parkway. The agreement calls for a minimum capital investment of \$22,000,000 in real property improvements. Majestic Realty requested the minimum capital

investment be reduced to \$13,000,000, which more accurately reflects the capital investment by excluding land and pre-development costs and is consistent with the values of similar buildings within the DFW Majestic Airport Center business park. This amendment reflects Majestic's request.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>:

That the City Council approve the amendment to the agreement as set forth in the caption above; and authorize the City Manager to execute the amendment.

6. <u>Approval of a Bid Award for an Annual Requirements Contract for</u> <u>Clamps, Fittings and Pipe to Core & Main LP, Dallas, Texas, for the</u> <u>Estimated Amount of \$140,018; and Authorization for the City Manager</u> to Execute the Contract.

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMENTS:

A total of twelve (12) requests for bids were downloaded from Bidsync.com. Two (2) bids were received and opened on March 14, 2019. This contract involves parts needed to make repairs to water and sewer lines. The term of the contract will be twelve (12) months, with options to extend for up to two (2) additional twelve (12) month periods, subject to the approval of the supplier and the City. Funding is available for this contract through various Utility Line Maintenance (ULM) accounts.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>:

That the City Council approve the award as set forth in the caption above.

7. <u>Approval of Economic Development Agreements Between the City of</u> <u>Lewisville and the Property Owners of 116 and 162 W Main Street to</u> <u>Allow the City to Install and Maintain Automatic Fire Sprinkler Systems;</u> <u>and Authorization for the City Manager to Execute the Agreements.</u>

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMENTS:

The City has approved a project to install automatic fire detection and suppression systems in buildings in the Old Town District. The City has received agreements and easements from the property owners of 116 W. Main Street and 162 W. Main Street. After City Council approves these agreements and future approvals for the remainder of the buildings in the program, staff will move forward with hiring a fire sprinkler contractor for the installation of the

systems.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>:

That the City Council approve the agreements; and authorize the City Manager to execute the agreements as set forth in the caption above.

8. Consideration of a Variance to Section 6-37 of the Lewisville City Code Regarding the Timing of the Parkland Dedication Requirement for The Village at Lewisville, a Proposed Multifamily Development Located at the Northeast Corner of Summit Avenue and Grandys Lane; Further Identified as a Portion of Lewisville Corporate Center, Lot 1 Block A; as Requested by Cross Engineering Consultants on Behalf of The NRP Group, the Developer, and FLSC LTD & FLCT LTD & NSHE Alpha Accommodation LLC, the Property Owner.

ADMINISTRATIVE COMMENTS:

Staff has been working with two developers, including The NRP Group, on a master open space plan for the Villages at Lewisville. In order to bring the master open space plan to fruition, a three-party development agreement is required. The development agreement cannot be completed until the master open space plan with cost estimates is complete. To allow The NRP Group to continue moving forward with the permitting process, staff is proposing a variance to Section 6-37 of the Lewisville City Code to allow the parkland dedication requirement (or cash-in-lieu of parkland dedication) to be paid prior to the issuance of the final certificate of occupancy.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>:

That the City Council approve the variance request as set forth in the caption above.
