Chairman Davis asked if there were any plans for campers parked that are not attached to vehicles. Medisetty stated that he does not know the answer.

RV parking will remain at 20 minutes in other zoning districts.

A motion was made by Mary Ellen Miksa to approve the item and seconded by Karen Locke to approve Consideration of an Consideration of an Amendment to the City Ordinance to Extend the Permitted Time for Recreational Vehicle Parking on Public Streets in Residential Zoning District and Make a Recommendation to the City Council Regarding the Amendment.
